- 1. In the passage from Micah, the people have been tempted to try to impress God with big, amazing gifts: burnt offerings, calves, rivers of oil, and more! But what the Lord really wants from the people is simple: do justice, love mercy, and walk humbly with God. In the book <u>The Gift of Nothing</u>, Mooch is looking for a gift for his friend Earl. Finally, Mooch realizes that what Earl needs is simply friendship. We may also be tempted to try to impress God with things that don't really matter, when what God wants is a relationship with us and for us to do God's will.

- 3. Play a game! One person will be blindfolded, and the other one will lead the blindfolded person around. Then switch! What is it like to lead and to be led? How is having someone lead you around like walking with God?
