1. The Oxford Learner's Dictionary defines transfiguration as, "a complete change of form or appearance into something more beautiful or spiritual." The passage today tells the story of the

- transfiguration of Jesus on the mountain. Will Willimon, a theologian, suggests that this story is best experienced by just listening to the passage with your eyes closed and imagining what happened. So, in a little bit, whether you are worshiping online, in the sanctuary, or in the chapel for Children's Worship, listen to the story with your eyes closed. What do you see?
- 2. Transfiguration Sunday always comes right before the first Sunday in Lent. We have two important days this week! First, we celebrate Shrove Tuesday. The name Shrove comes from the old word "shrive" which means to confess. In the Middle Ages, people would confess their sins on Shrove Tuesday to begin the penitent Lenten season with a clean slate! Shrove Tuesday is a day of celebration as well as repentance. Lent is historically a time of giving things up, so Shrove Tuesday is the last chance to indulge. Then we have Ash Wednesday! On Ash Wednesday, we mark ourselves with ashes as a reminder that we are dust and to dust we shall return. We hope to see you on Tuesday and Wednesday!
- 3. Check out a <u>coloring page</u>, <u>word search</u>, or <u>crossword</u>. Maybe you will draw your own picture of the transfiguration.
- 4. Journal, considering the following:
 - a. The disciples saw Jesus begin to shine like the sun. I wonder how you picture Jesus.
 - b. I wonder what you think God looks like.
 - c. I wonder why Peter wanted to stay and build an altar there.
 - d. I wonder if we see God in other people like Jesus saw God in Elijah and Moses.

And he was transfigured before them, and his face shone like the sun, and his clothes became dazzling white. Suddenly there appeared to them Moses and Elijah, talking with him. Then Peter said to Jesus, "Lord, it is good for us to be here; if you wish, I will make three dwellings here, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah. While he was still speaking, suddenly a bright cloud overshadowed them, and from the cloud a voice said, "This is my Son, the Beloved; with him I am well pleased; listen to him!" When the disciples heard this, they fell to the ground and were overcome by fear. But Jesus came and touched them, saying, "Get up and do not be afraid." And when they looked up, they saw no one except Jesus himself alone. As they were coming down the mountain, Jesus ordered them, "Tell no one about the vision until after the Son of Man has been raised from the dead."
