- 1. In the book <u>Ruby Finds a Worry</u>, Ruby finds herself accompanied by a Worry a small yellow creature who starts small but begins to grow. The Worry becomes enormous. In the letter from Peter today, he also talks about worries. Peter knows that the Christians to whom he is speaking have many worries. Peter is living in this time and he offers God's people encouragement in these hard times. Peter commands them to cast all their anxieties and worries on God because God cares for them. This suffering will come to an end and God will restore, support, and strengthen them. Would these words encourage you if you were suffering or having trouble? What words would you remember and repeat to yourself?
- 2. Today is the closest Sunday to "Ascension Day," which was on Thursday. On Ascension Day, we remember how Jesus ascended into heaven. Before he goes, he leaves the disciples with instructions about how to live and how to carry on his ministry. In some ways, it seems like Jesus "passes the baton" to the disciples when he ascends into heaven. Have a relay race today and think about what it means to "pass the baton."
- 3. Check out some <u>art</u> from the story of Jesus' ascension into heaven. Various artists have tried to envision what it looked like. How would you draw the story? What do you notice about each artist's depiction?
- 4. Journal, considering the following:
 - a. What do you do when you feel worried?
 - b. What questions do you still have about Jesus' ascension into heaven (Acts 1:1-11)?
 - c. What does it mean for us that Jesus has ascended into heaven? What's our job now?

Reading from the Old Testament

Psalm 68:4-10

And after you have suffered for a little while, the God of all grace, who has called you to his eternal glory in Christ, will himself restore, support, strengthen, and establish you. 
