- Today is a communion day! It's a good idea to talk about communion each time we receive it. <u>This readaloud</u> of *At God's Table* by Maria Eugenia Cornou, Carrie Steenwyk, and John D. Witvliet, illustrated by Joel Schoon-Tanis, gives us some good ideas about what communion is and some great conversation starters.
- 2. In the gospel passage from John, Jesus tells the disciples that if they have seen him, they have also seen God. This helps us know that by learning the stories of Jesus, we can also learn about God. One of my very favorite songs is "Tell Me the Stories of Jesus." Check out this video that also includes lyrics and some scenes of Jesus's life. What do they teach us about who God is?
- 3. What is something that seemed really hard, but you can now do? Maybe it is riding a bike on two wheels, or memorizing your multiplication tables. Maybe it was passing the swim test or learning how to read. Draw a picture of yourself as you were learning, and then draw a picture of Jesus right beside you. Another lesson from the scripture passage is that Jesus is right there with us when we are doing hard things. Hang your picture up as a reminder the next time you have to do a hard thing.
- 4. Journal, considering the following:
 - a. Why do you think Jesus had to tell the disciples not to be afraid?
 - b. What are some of the things the disciples did after Jesus went to heaven?
 - c. What about times we pray for something that seems very good, like for someone we love to get well, and it does not happen? Does that mean that we were not praying in the right way?


