### **Church Family Moment**

- 1. Today's scripture is often called "The Great Commission." A commission is like a job that is given to you. So, Jesus is giving the disciples a job to do. He tells them to go and make disciples all over the world. Today, we are the disciples, so this is a job that Jesus has given to us, too! We make disciples by telling others about the love that Jesus has for them, and even more so by showing them that love. How can you share the stories and show the love of Jesus this week?
- 2. Play follow the leader or Simon Says. Think about what it means to follow Jesus.
- 3. Today in worship, we are celebrating God's gift of music. Music is part of so many of our favorite Bible stories. Miriam danced after the Israelites escaped Egypt. God told Job that at creation, the morning stars sang. The angels sang when Jesus was born. The book of Psalms contains a multitude of songs. Wherever you are today, celebrate God's gift of music! Share your favorite hymns with someone else.
- 4. Journal, considering the following:
  - a. The text says, "When they saw him, they worshiped him; but some doubted." I wonder what we would do if we were in the disciples' shoes worship him, doubt, or a little of both?
  - b. Jesus gives them and us authority over heaven and earth to spread the Good News. I wonder what that means?
  - c. In what ways has music shaped your faith?

### **Reading from the Old Testament**

Psalm 22:23-31


