# We Hear and Respond to the Word

### **Church Family Moment**

- In the Gospel passage from today, we are reminded that God asks us
  to do difficult things. Sometimes, following in the way of Jesus means
  that people will not like us. We get our strength to continue to follow
  God, even in difficult times, from knowing that we are beloved
  children of God. In the book <u>A Love Letter from God</u> by P.K. Hallinan,
  we are reminded just how much God cherishes us.
- 2. In verse 30 of our Gospel passage from Matthew, Jesus says that God knows the number of hairs on our heads! Sit down with someone in your house, and see how many hairs you can count on their head in 60 seconds. What does this tell you about how well God knows you?
- 3. I wonder what the kind of world in our Gospel passage would look like. What would it look like for people to be equal, for us to not be fearful, for things to be out in the open, and for us to put God first? Create a drawing of what this world would be like.
- 4. Journal, considering the following:
  - a. I wonder what it was like for those listening to Jesus' words for the first time. What do you think their response may have been?
  - b. I wonder why these words are difficult to hear.
  - c. I wonder how these words might make us feel free?

## **Reading from the Old Testament**

Psalm 69:7-13

It is for your sake that I have borne reproach, that shame has covered my face. I have become a stranger to my kindred, an alien to my mother's children. It is zeal for your house that has consumed me; the insults of those who insult you have fallen on me. When I humbled my soul with fasting, they insulted me for doing so. When I made sackcloth my clothing, I became a byword to them. I am the subject of gossip for those who sit in the gate, and the drunkards make songs about me. But as for me, my prayer is to you, O Lord. At an acceptable time, O God, in the abundance of your steadfast love, answer me.

### **Reading from the Gospels**

Matthew 10:24-39

A disciple is not above the teacher, nor a slave above the master; it is enough for the disciple to be like the teacher, and the slave like the master. If they have called the master of the house Beelzebul, how much more will they malign those of his household! So have no fear of them; for nothing is covered up that will not be uncovered, and nothing secret that will not become known. What I say to you in the dark, tell in the light; and what you hear whispered, proclaim from the housetops. Do not fear those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; rather fear him who can destroy both soul and body in hell. Are not two sparrows sold for a penny? Yet not one of them will fall to the ground apart from your Father. And even the hairs of your head are all counted. So do not be afraid; you are of more value than many sparrows. Everyone therefore who acknowledges me before others, I also will acknowledge before my Father in heaven; but whoever denies me before others, I also will deny before my Father in heaven. Do not think that I have come to bring peace to the earth; I have not come to bring peace, but a sword. For I have come to set a man against his father, and a daughter against her mother, and a daughter-in-law against her and one's foes will be members of one's own mother-in-law: household. Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me; and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me; and whoever does not take up the cross and follow me is not worthy of me. Those who find their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake will find it.
