In the book <u>The Story of And: The Little Word</u> <u>that Changed the World</u>, one little word helps a variety of opinionated shapes overcome their differences to create something entirely new. <u>Listen to a readaloud</u> of the book, sing along with the single that Carrie Newcomer wrote and recorded to go along with the book, and <u>check out this activity page</u>. In the New Testament reading from Romans today, Paul is reminding us that we have all been joined together as one family through Jesus.

- 2. Draw a picture that represents all the people who are God's children. Who did you include? Why? Is there anyone you left out? Think about what color skin and hair everyone might have. What ages are included? How about people who have disabilities? Make your picture as inclusive and diverse as you can!
- 3. Remind someone today that they are a child of God, and that means that they are valuable. Maybe you will tell them in person or on the phone, or maybe you'll send them a text or write a letter. Why is this person valuable to you?
- 4. Journal, considering the following:
 - a. What does it mean to you to be part of the family of faith? In happy times? How about in tough times?
 - b. Are there times when you feel that you don't belong? Why do you think that is?
 - c. Who is part of the family of God?
 - d. How can you help others to feel like part of the family of God?

Teach me your way, O Lord, that I may walk in your truth; give me an undivided heart to revere your name. I give thanks to you, O Lord my God, with my whole heart, and I will glorify your name forever. For great is your steadfast love toward me; you have delivered my soul from the depths of Sheol.

Reading from the New Testament

So then, brothers and sisters, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh—for if you live according to the flesh, you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live. For all who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God. For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received a spirit of adoption. When we cry, "Abba! Father!" it is that very Spirit bearing witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if

children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ—if, in fact, we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him. I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory about to be revealed to us. For the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the children of God; for the creation was subjected to futility, not of its own will but by the will of the one who subjected it, in hope that the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to decay and will obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God. We know that the whole creation has been groaning in labor pains until now; and not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly while we wait for adoption, the redemption of our bodies. For in hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what is seen? But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience.

SANCTUARY FUND CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE

Our *From Strength to Strength 2020-2025 Sanctuary Fund* capital campaign has completed its third year, and receipts on pledges are excellent! Total pledges and gifts to the five-year campaign are \$3,100,000, and we have collected \$2,200,000, or 71%. Thank you to all our families that have faithfully supported this campaign!

The goal of the From Strength to Strength campaign is to pay off our sanctuary mortgage, and our goal is within reach! To meet our campaign goal of \$3,250,000 and be debt-free in 2025, we need additional pledges (over the remaining two years of the campaign) or one-time gifts to this campaign totaling \$150,000.
