- 1. <u>Listen to a read aloud</u> of *Stone Soup* by Marcia Brown. Each villager takes what she has and adds it to the soup! By working together, they made the best soup ever. This stone soup is like our church. We are all important and we all need to work together. We can do this by adding our talents and ideas to the soup. What do you have to offer to the church? How do you serve?
- 2. Romans 8:38-39 is one of my very favorite scripture passages! Sometimes, I am tempted to feel like God's love depends on me and what I do, and I forget that God's love is a no matter what kind of love that I can never, ever lose. Use a coloring page to meditate on the passage. What does it mean that God never, ever stops loving us? How does it make you feel?
- 3. Play a game with some balloons. Blow up the balloons, and use a permanent marker to write something that gets in the way of our relationship with God, perhaps something listed in Romans 8:38-39, like "life, death, fear," etc. Pop the balloon and remember that nothing can separate us from the love of God!
- 4. Journal, considering the following:
 - a. What does it mean that God's love never stops?
 - b. What does the Bible say that we have become through Christ? What does that mean to you?
 - c. If nothing can ever separate us from God, then what do we have to be afraid of? Is it hard to live like that's true? Why or why not?
 - d. What would you say to someone to explain this passage?

Reading from the Old Testament

1 Kings 3:5-12

At Gibeon the Lord appeared to Solomon in a dream by night; and God said, "Ask what I should give you." And Solomon said, "You have shown great and steadfast love to your servant my father David, because he

walked before you in faithfulness, in righteousness, and in uprightness of heart toward you; and you have kept for him this great and steadfast love, and have given him a son to sit on his throne today. And now, O Lord my God, you have made your servant king in place of my father David, although I am only a little child; I do not know how to go out or come in. And your servant is in the midst of the people whom you have chosen, a great people, so numerous they cannot be numbered or counted. Give your servant therefore an understanding mind to govern your people, able to discern between good and evil; for who can govern this your great people?" It pleased the Lord that Solomon had asked this. God said to him, "Because you have asked this, and have not asked for yourself long life or riches, or for the life of your enemies, but have asked for yourself understanding to discern what is right, I now do according to your word. Indeed I give you a wise and discerning mind; no one like you has been before you and no one like you shall arise after you.

Reading from the New Testament

Romans 8:26-39

Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but that very Spirit intercedes with sighs too deep for words. And God, who searches the heart, knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God. We know that all things work together for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose. For those whom he foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, in order that he might be the firstborn within a large family. And those whom he predestined he also called; and those whom he called he also justified; and those whom he justified he also glorified. What then are we to say about these things? If God is for us, who is against us? He who did not withhold his own Son, but gave him up for all of us, will he not with him also give us everything else? Who will bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. Who is to condemn? It is Christ Jesus, who died, yes, who was raised, who is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us. Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will hardship, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? As it is written, "For your sake we are being killed all day long; we are accounted as sheep to be slaughtered." No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.
