1. In the passage today, some people ask Jesus a tricky question, and he responds by asking them to look at their coins. If you are worshiping from home, maybe you can look at some of your coins. Who or what do you see on the coins? Ask an adult for some help. Why do you think those images are on the coins? If God had a coin, what image would be on it?

- 2. Color a page with today's verse on it, and while you are coloring, consider what it means to give to God what is God's. What does belong to God?
- 3. Listen to a readaloud of A Chair for My Mother by Vera B. Williams. In the book, the girl learns an important lesson about what is really important, and she also makes sacrifices for someone that she loves. Jesus teaches us that people are always more important than money, and that everything and everyone belongs to God. How do you see this illustrated in the story?
- 4. Journal, considering the following:
 - a. Why do you think the people were trying to trick Jesus into answering a tricky question?
 - b. I wonder what Jesus meant when he said, "give to the emperor the things that are the emperor's."
 - c. I wonder what Jesus meant when he said give "to God the things that are God's"?
 - d. How do you think we do give to God?
