- 1. In today's Gospel lesson, Jesus talks about waiting. <u>Listen to a readaloud</u> of Wait! by Antoinette Portis. In the story, the boy teaches his mother a lesson about the value of waiting. We are about to enter a season of waiting, Advent. What is valuable about waiting?
- 2. Do you know the song "Give Me Oil in My Lamp?" Here is a version that you can sing along with! This song is based on the parable for today. Do you know how an oil lamp works? If not, ask an adult to explain it to you! What does it mean to ask God to give us oil for our lamp?
- 3. Play "Be Ready," a game similar to Red Light/Green Light. Stand on a line. The leader will say, "BE READY!" Then, when she says, "GO!" everyone will walk quickly until the leader says, "Stop!" When everyone has reached the "finish line" the game is over.
- 4. Journal, considering the following:
 - a. What did you like about today's scripture? What do you have questions about?
 - b. What do you think the parable means? What could it be telling us for today?
 - c. What does this parable teach us about being the people of God?
