1. Let's think about shepherds today! There are shepherds in the story of Jesus' birth, and there is also the image of God as a shepherd in the passage from Isaiah. Think about the shepherd-like ways God takes



- care of us-- provides food, walks with us in the dangerous places, rescues us when we get into trouble, etc. One of the ornaments on our Chrismon tree is of a shepherd's crook to remind us of this special relationship we have with God. Maybe you will make a shepherd's crook ornament. You can also use this QR code or <u>link</u> to learn more about the Chrismon ornaments on our tree at SMPC!
- 2. Sing the first hymn we sang today again after you have read the passage. How does it help us to understand what the scripture is saying to us? If you are worshiping from home, you might want to use this link for a youtube video of the hymn.
- 3. Listen to a <u>readaloud</u> of *Come On, Rain!* by Karen Hesse. In the story, the people are waiting for rain. We are also waiting during this Advent season. When the rain finally comes, the people are so joyful they are overcome, just like we will be at Christmas! What is it like waiting for Christmas? Do you ever feel like Christmas Day will never come?
- 4. Journal, considering the following:
 - a. I wonder why Isaiah would tell the people of God this lesson. What do you think?
 - b. I wonder what Isaiah means by saying, "Prepare the way of the Lord?" What do you think?
 - c. According to Isaiah, who should the people of God put their trust in? Why do you think Isaiah would tell them this?
 - d. Who are some people that help you prepare the way for Jesus?

Second Reading Isaiah 40:1-11 Dr. Brown

Comfort, O comfort my people, says your God. Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that she has served her term, that her penalty is paid, that she has received from the Lord's hand double for all her sins. A voice cries out: "In the wilderness prepare the way of the Lord, make straight in the desert a highway for our God. Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain. Then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together, for the mouth of the Lord has spoken." A voice says, "Cry out!" And I said, "What shall I cry?" All people are grass, their constancy is like the flower of the field. The grass withers, the flower fades, when the breath of the Lord blows upon it; surely the people are grass. The grass withers, the flower fades; but the word of our God will stand forever. Get you up to a high mountain, O Zion, herald of good tidings; lift up your voice with strength, O Jerusalem, herald of good tidings, lift it up, do not fear; say to the cities of Judah, "Here is your God!" See, the Lord God comes with might, and his arm rules for him; his reward is with him, and his recompense before him. He will feed his flock like a shepherd; he will gather the lambs in his arms, and carry them in his bosom, and gently lead the mother sheep.
