1. If you are here in person today, we hope you'll stay after worship for our Christmas Trivia! You can see how much you know about what the Bible says about the birth of Jesus. If you are worshipping online, here is a QR code where you can play at your own pace.



- 2. Today is the Advent Sunday of Joy! Make some joyful art. Write the word "JOY" very large in the center of a piece of paper. Maybe you will use bubble letters. Then, fill the rest of your paper with joyful decorations. This also works if you are staying in the sanctuary for worship! You can use the boards in the worship bags to make art. If you use paper, hang up your art somewhere that you will see it to remind you that Advent is a time for joy.
- 3. Sing Joy to the World! The very first verse reminds us why we should be joyful during Advent. Joy is not the same as happiness. Joy is something that we can choose. We can't always choose to be happy, but we can always choose to find some joy, even in very sad times.
- 4. Journal, considering the following:
 - a. Who did those sent by the religious authorities think John might be? Who does John say that he is? (John 1:23)
 - b. Who does the writer of the Gospel of John say that John the Baptist is? (John 1:6-8)
 - c. Why do you think God needed John the Baptist to prepare or "make straight the way of the Lord"? To stay awake, be alert, be ready?
 - d. What are some ways that you choose joy?

Second Reading John 1:6-8; 19-28 Dr. Matthew S. Brown There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. This is the testimony given by John when the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, "Who are you?" He confessed and did not deny it, but confessed, "I am not the Messiah." And they asked him, "What then? Are you Elijah?" He said, "I am not." "Are you the prophet?" He answered, "No." Then they said to him, "Who are you? Let us have an answer for those who sent us. What do you say about yourself?" He said, "I am the voice of one crying out in the wilderness, "Make straight the way of the Lord,' " as the prophet Isaiah said. Now they had been sent from the Pharisees. They asked him, "Why then are you baptizing if you are neither the Messiah, nor Elijah, nor the prophet?" John answered them, "I baptize with water. Among you stands one whom you do not know, the one who is coming after me; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandal." This took place in Bethany across the Jordan where John was baptizing.

Sermon Witness Dr. Brown **The Affirmation of Faith** (unison) The Confession of 1967 — 9.35-9.37 Rev. Odom

Wherever the church exists, its members are both gathered in corporate life and dispersed in society for the sake of mission in the world.

The church gathers to praise God, to hear God's word for humankind, to baptize and to join in the Lord's Supper, to pray for and present the world to God in worship, to enjoy fellowship, to receive instruction, strength, and comfort, to order and organize its own corporate life, to be tested, renewed, and reformed, and to speak and act in the world's affairs as may be appropriate to the needs of the time.

The church disperses to serve God wherever its members are, at work or play, in private or in the life of society. Their prayer and Bible Study are part of the church's worship and theological reflection. Their witness is the church's evangelism. Their daily action in the world is the church in mission to the world. The quality of their relation with other persons is the measure of the church's fidelity.
