Church Family Moment

1. It is a prayer practice in churches all over the world to give people a star word on this Epiphany Sunday. Many of us experience prayer

as talking to God as opposed to silence or contemplation. However, this prayer practice invites a new prayer rhythm of reflection and review that can be a powerful way to connect with God. During Communion today, you will be invited to select a star word. The words will be placed facedown in a basket. When you come forward, take a word, not looking to see what it is before choosing! Consider this a guiding word for the year ahead. We invite you to remember your star word often, seeking the ways God might be moving through the meanings and definitions the word contains. - The Last Straw by Fredrick Thury tells the story of the wise men from the point of view of a camel named Hoshmakaka. He is old, achy, and cranky, but he finally realizes the importance of his task to carry gifts to the newborn baby king. Listen to a <u>readaloud</u> and consider what it was like for the wise men.
- 3. Make a star craft. You can use pipe cleaners, aluminum foil, or just paper and scissors. Hang your star somewhere to remind you to continually seek Jesus.
- 4. Journal, considering the following:
 - a. What can we learn from the magi, who sought Jesus? What do they teach us about seeking Christ?
 - b. Why does Mathew include the holy family's escape to Egypt in the gospel? What does it have to say about refugees?
 - c. Look back at all of the humans involved in the story of Christ's birth as it unfolds—Mary, Joseph, Elizabeth, the shepherds, Herod, the Magi. As God intervenes in their lives (in mysterious and startling ways), what does each person seek? As we begin this new year, what are we seeking?

First ReadingIsaiah 60:1-6Dr. BrownArise, shine; for your light has come, and the glory of the Lord has risenupon you. For darkness shall cover the earth, and thick darkness thepeoples; but the Lord will arise upon you, and his glory will appear over

you. Nations shall come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your dawn. Lift up your eyes and look around; they all gather together, they come to you; your sons shall come from far away, and your daughters shall be carried on their nurses' arms. Then you shall see and be radiant; your heart shall thrill and rejoice, because the abundance of the sea shall be brought to you, the wealth of the nations shall come to you. A multitude of camels shall cover you, the young camels of Midian and Ephah; all those from Sheba shall come. They shall bring gold and frankincense, and shall proclaim the praise of the Lord.

Second Reading Matthew 2:1-12 Dr. Whitney Bayer In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, asking, "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage." When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him; and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born. They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet: "And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who is to shepherd my people Israel.' " Then Herod secretly called for the wise men and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage." When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.
