- What do you think it would be like to live without sunlight? In the arctic circle, there is a two month long "Polar Night" every year, when the sun does not rise. Watch <u>this video</u> about the polar night. Why do you think God made light? Why do we need light?
- 2. The hymn "Morning Has Broken" is about the sun rising, just as it did on the first day of creation. <u>Listen and sing along</u>. What does the hymn help you understand about creation? About God?
- 3. To help think about the difference between light and darkness, do some scratch print art. If you have scratch art paper, use it, or make your own by coloring a piece of paper with lots of different colors of crayons. Then, color very darkly on top with a black crayon. Use a pencil or toothpick to draw. Draw images that make you think of light, like a sun or a lightbulb. What else makes you think of light?
- 4. Journal, considering the following:
 - a. I wonder what it was like before God created light. What do you think?
 - b. I wonder how you would feel if you were there during Creation.
 - c. Do you think there was any sound when the light was created?
 - d. What other powerful things has God done that you know about?
