1. Today is Camp and Retreat Sunday! One of the youth group's favorite energizers that they learned at the Massanetta Springs and Montreat

- youth conferences is called "Revolution." We're going to learn it in Children's Worship today. <u>Here</u> is a version with instructions and <u>one</u> from Montreat.
- 2. This is an Alphabet Psalm. Each lettered verse is a separate prayer within the larger prayer. Make an acrostic prayer! Maybe you will use a name for God, like Savior, Shepherd, or Creator. Maybe you will use your own name and talk about what God is like for you.
- 3. Our Lenten word for today is "Truth." Listen to a <u>readaloud</u> of Ruthie and the (Not So) Teeny Tiny Lie. Ruthie was a lover of teeny tiny things. Ruthie finds a teeny tiny camera on the playground at school and when the real owner asked her to return it, she claimed that it was hers. She lied to the teacher when she was asked if she was the owner. Ruthie learns why lying is a bad choice. Why is it important to tell the truth?
- 4. Journal, considering the following:
 - a. What spiritually formational experiences have you had at camps, retreats, and conference centers? How have they impacted you?
 - b. What is the truth? How do we know the truth?
 - c. What's important about telling the truth?

From: The Theological Declaration of Barmen

Written by representatives of Lutheran, Reformed, and United churches of Germany in 1934 to oppose any accommodation of German Christians and churches to the Nazi regime of Adolph Hitler.

Jesus Christ, as he is attested for us in Holy Scripture, is the one Word of God which we have to hear and which we have to trust and obey in life and in death.

We reject the false doctrine, as though the church could and would have to acknowledge as a source of its proclamation, apart from and besides this one Word of God, still other events and powers, figures and truths, as God's revelation.

As Jesus Christ is God's assurance of the forgiveness of all our sins, so in the same way and with the same seriousness is he also God's mighty claim upon our whole life. Through him befalls us a joyful deliverance from the godless fetters of this world for a free, grateful service to his creatures.

We reject the false doctrine, as though there were areas of our life in which we would not belong to Jesus Christ, but to other lords—areas in which we would not need justification and sanctification through him.

The Christian Church is the congregation of the brethren in which Jesus Christ acts presently as the Lord in Word and Sacrament through the Holy Spirit. As the Church of pardoned sinners, it has to testify in the midst of a sinful world, with its faith as with its obedience, with its message as with its order, that it is solely his property, and that it lives and wants to live solely from his comfort and from his direction in the expectation of his appearance.


