



We Hear and Respond to the Word

Church Family Moment Rebecca Guzman 1. Our Lenten word for today is "forsaken." Jesus asked, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" We are reading Psalm 22 because Jesus was reciting a Psalm that he knew. These same words can be found in Psalm 22. What hymns, prayers, and scripture have you memorized?

- 2. When I was little, my favorite book was Alexander and the Terrible, Horrible, No Good, Very Bad Day by Judith Viorst. You can see and hear a read-aloud of it <u>here</u>. I think the reason I loved it so much was that it reminded me that other people have bad days too. I'm not comparing the day Jesus died to a regular bad day, but I do think that it's important for us to know and understand that Jesus knew about all of our feelings—of being "forsaken," sad, lonely, and hopeless. What do you notice about Alexander's bad day?
- 3. Play hide and seek. Make sure you take turns so that everyone gets to hide and to seek. As you play, think about how it feels to be lost and alone. What does it feel like to be found? What does it feel like to know that Jesus may have felt lost and alone too?
- 4. Journal, considering the following:
 - a. What are some songs or scriptures you know by heart like Jesus and his community knew the Psalms?
 - b. What do you do when you feel alone and hopeless?
 - c. Has God ever felt very near to you? What was that like?
 - d. Has God ever felt very far from you? What was that like?

Prayer for Illumination

First Reading Psalm 22:1-15 Rev. Odom My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? Why are you so far from helping me, from the words of my groaning? O my God, I cry by day, but you do not answer; and by night, but find no rest. Yet you are holy, enthroned on the praises of Israel. In you our ancestors trusted; they trusted, and you delivered them. To you they cried, and were saved; in you they trusted, and were not put to shame. But I am a worm, and not human; scorned by others, and despised by the people. All who see me mock at me; they make mouths at me, they shake their heads; "Commit your cause to the Lord; let him deliver - let him rescue the one in whom he delights!" Yet it was you who took me from the womb; you kept me safe on my mother's breast. On you I was cast from my birth, and since my mother bore me you have been my God. Do not be far from me, for trouble is near and there is no one to help. Many bulls encircle me, strong bulls of Bashan surround me; they open wide their mouths at me, like a ravening and roaring lion. I am poured out like water, and all my bones are out of joint; my heart is like wax; it is melted within my breast; my mouth is dried up like a potsherd, and my tongue sticks to my jaws; you lay me in the dust of death.

Save me from the mouth of the lion! From the horns of the wild oxen you have rescued me. I will tell of your name to my brothers and sisters; in the midst of the congregation I will praise you: You who fear the Lord, praise him! All you offspring of Jacob, glorify him; stand in awe of him, all you offspring of Israel! For he did not despise or abhor the affliction of the afflicted; he did not hide his face from me, but heard when I cried to him. From you comes my praise in the great congregation; my vows I will pay before those who fear him. The poor shall eat and be satisfied; those who seek him shall praise the Lord. May your hearts live forever! All the ends of the earth shall remember and turn to the Lord; and all the families of the nations shall worship before him. For dominion belongs to the Lord, and he rules over the nations. To him, indeed, shall all who sleep in the earth bow down; before him shall bow all who go down to the dust, and I shall live for him. Posterity will serve him; future generations will be told about the Lord, and proclaim his deliverance to a people yet unborn, saying that he has done it.


