- 1. We are continuing to talk about the questions that you asked! Here are two for today: "How do we know God is real?" and "How is it possible that God is always there?" Here's a vocabulary word: omnipresence. The omnipresence of God is a theological concept that affirms God is everywhere, all the time. How is this possible? And how do we know God is real? Both of these questions have a similar answer: faith. We cannot prove that God is real, and we can't prove that God is everywhere all the time, but we can experience God.
- 2. Our <u>Year of Justice theme for April is Earth Day</u>. Lots of Christians like to think about Earth Day as a reminder that God trusted us to care for all of creation. The Year of Justice gives some options including a book to read together, questions for conversation, and lots of idea for what to do together. There's also a link to <u>this website</u>, which has great ideas for celebrating Earth Day every day.
- 3. Make a sheep craft! You can come up with an easy one on your own using cotton balls and whatever you have around your house or you can print and cut out <u>this one</u>. Just glue the sheep to the bottom of the staff. Hang up your craft to remind you that Jesus knows and loves you as a Good Shepherd.
- 4. Journal, considering the following:
 - a. What does Jesus say is the difference between the hired hand and the Good Shepherd?
 - b. What does it mean that Jesus knows his own and his own know him? What does that mean to you?
 - c. Who are your shepherds? Who is your Shepherd?

John 10: 11-18

"I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. The hired hand, who is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away—and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. The hired hand runs away because a hired hand does not care for the sheep. I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father. And I lay down my life for the sheep. I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd. For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it up again. I have received this command from my Father."
