 Today is Confirmation Sunday! Some of the questions I received had to do with Confirmation. In the Presbyterian Church, we baptize people of all ages, including babies and young children. Obviously, this means that they have not made a



personal decision to follow the way of Jesus. So, when those kids reach eighth grade, they are given a choice to join the Confirmation Class. At SMPC, they spend a whole school year learning together and then in May, they write their own Statements of Faith and claim the promises that their parents or caregivers made to them in Baptism. Today, we celebrate that claim with them and formally welcome them to be adult members of the church, who can vote in congregational meetings.

- 2. In our scripture today, Jesus is praying for his friends. Take some time to pray for your friends. If you haven't yet learned how to write, you can draw a picture of your friend(s). Or you might try praying in color. Using <u>this template</u>, write the name of your friend in the middle. You can then pray for specific things by writing them around, or just color it in. Remember that prayer doesn't always have to use words.
- 3. Print and complete a coloring page, word search, crossword, or maze.
- 4. Journal, considering the following:
 - a. Who is the "them" Jesus is talking to God about? Are we included?
 - b. What does it mean for us to be "protected from the evil one"?
 - c. What does it mean for us to be sent into the world? What's our mission?

Second Reading John 17:6-19 Dr. Brown "I have made your name known to those whom you gave me from the world. They were yours, and you gave them to me, and they have kept your word. Now they know that everything you have given me is from you; for the words that you gave to me I have given to them, and they have received them and know in truth that I came from you; and they have believed that you sent me. I am asking on their behalf; I am not asking on behalf of the world, but on behalf of those whom you gave me, because they are yours. All mine are yours, and yours are mine; and I have been glorified in them. And now I am no longer in the world, but they are in the world, and I am coming to you. Holy Father, protect them in your name that you have given me, so that they may be one, as we are one. While I was with them, I protected them in your name that you have given me. I guarded them, and not one of them was lost except the one destined to be lost, so that the scripture might be fulfilled. But now I am coming to you, and I speak these things in the world so that they may have my joy made complete in themselves. I have given them your word, and the world has hated them because they do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world. I am not asking you to take them out of the world, but I ask you to protect them from the evil one. They do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world. Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth. As you have sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world. And for their sakes I sanctify myself, so that they also may be sanctified in truth.
