1. Today is our blessing of the backpacks! Many times, students and teachers set educational goals for the year, and those are great. I wonder if we might think about spiritual goals for the year. We've gotten off to a great start by packing backpacks for Smithfield Elementary to ensure every child has the supplies they need to start the year off well! What kinds of spiritual practices could we incorporate into our year? Could we start the day with a prayer? - 4. Journal, considering the following:

 - b. How does God make us courageous?
 - c. What makes a person trustworthy?
