1. <u>Listen to a readaloud</u> of *The Pain and the Great One* by Judy Blume. This story is kind of like a version of the disciples' discussion about who is the greatest. We all want to be special and the most loved, but Jesus is telling us that those feelings are dead ends. We need to stop worrying about ourselves and start paying attention to people



- about ourselves and start paying attention to people around us. The surprising thing is that when we do that, we are happier.

 - c) What do you think he means when Jesus says, "Whoever wants to be first must be last of all and a servant to all"?
 - d) To what extent would we say that children are valued in our community and in our culture?

First Reading Deuteronomy 4:9-14 Rev. Odom But take care and watch yourselves closely, so as neither to forget the things that your eyes have seen nor to let them slip from your mind all the days of your life; make them known to your children and your children's children—how you once stood before the Lord your God at Horeb, when the Lord said to me, "Assemble the people for me, and I will let them hear my words, so that they may learn to fear me as long as they live on the earth, and may teach their children so"; you approached and stood at the foot of the mountain while the mountain was blazing up to the very heavens, shrouded in dark clouds. Then the Lord spoke to you out of the fire. You heard the sound of words but saw no form; there was only a voice. He declared to you his covenant, which he charged you to observe, that is, the ten commandments; and he wrote them on two stone tablets. And the Lord charged me at that time to teach you statutes and ordinances for you to observe in the land that you are about to cross into and occupy.

Second Reading Mark 9:30-37 Dr. Matthew S. Brown They went on from there and passed through Galilee. He did not want anyone to know it; for he was teaching his disciples, saying to them, "The Son of Man is to be betrayed into human hands, and they will kill him, and three days after being killed, he will rise again." But they did not understand what he was saying and were afraid to ask him. Then they came to Capernaum; and when he was in the house he asked them, "What were you arguing about on the way?" But they were silent, for on the way they had argued with one another who was the greatest. He sat down, called the twelve, and said to them, "Whoever wants to be first must be last of all and servant of all." Then he took a little child and put it among them; and taking it in his

arms, he said to them, "Whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me, and whoever welcomes me welcomes not me but the one who sent me."
