

2. Our scripture readings today are from Malachi and Luke. Find Malachi in your Bible. Now find Luke. The Malachi scripture is

predicting what happens in Luke. There aren't that many pages in the Bible, but there are 400 years between these writings! Think about how long that is! For comparison, 400 years ago was 1624. The Declaration of Independence hadn't even been written! Think about how long that was for the people to wait. What do you think it was like for them?

- 3. Malachi's message is not an easy one. He's a prophet who is telling us that sometimes, following God will be very difficult. Think about taking a medicine that tastes terrible or getting a shot. How about putting on lotion when your skin is really dry and it stings?! Sometimes, we have to do things that are hard in order to be the kind of people that God wants us to be. Draw a picture of a time you had to do something difficult so that you could be better.
- 4. Journal, considering the following:
 - a. What is a messenger? What's their job?
 - b. When have you had to do something difficult that helped you get better?
 - c. What does it mean for something to be purified?

Luke 3:1-6

Dr. Bayer
In the fifteenth year of the reign of Emperor Tiberius, when Pontius Pilate
was governor of Judea, and Herod was ruler of Galilee, and his brother
Philip ruler of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias ruler of
Abilene, during the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of
God came to John son of Zechariah in the wilderness. He went into all the
region around the Jordan, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the
forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the words of the prophet
Isaiah, "The voice of one crying out in the wilderness: "Prepare the way

Second Reading Malachi 2:17-3:4 Dr. Brown

You have wearied the Lord with your words. Yet you say, "How have we wearied him?" By saying, "All who do evil are good in the sight of the Lord, and he delights in them." Or by asking, "Where is the God of justice?" See, I am sending my messenger to prepare the way before me, and the Lord whom you seek will suddenly come to his temple. The messenger of the covenant in whom you delight—indeed, he is coming, says the Lord of hosts. But who can endure the day of his coming, and who can stand when he appears? For he is like a refiner's fire and like fullers' soap; he will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver, and he will purify the descendants of Levi and refine them like gold and silver, until they present offerings to the Lord in righteousness. Then the offering of Judah and Jerusalem will be pleasing to the Lord as in the days of old and as in former years.


