

# We Hear and Respond to the Word

### **Church Family Moment**

 Don't resist the temptation to illustrate this story with some good old-fashioned Kool-Aid! They even make the kind now where you can just put a few drops into the bottom of an empty pitcher and then fill it with water, or you can use the powdered kind. Of course, this is not a miracle,

but it is a lot of fun to imagine what it was like for the disciples to witness this miracle!

- 2. Illustrate this story. Make sure to include facial expressions for the people when they realized that Jesus had performed his first miracle! You can use anything you want to draw and color.
- 3. Listen to a <u>readaloud</u> of *Fancy Nancy and the Wedding of the Century* by Jane O'Connor. Nancy attends her uncle's wedding, and it isn't as fancy as she had hoped it would be. Still, she can share some of her own joy and creativity. Weddings are often occasions when lots of things can go wrong, but there is joy in the celebration. Why do you think Jesus' first miracle is at a wedding feast? What could this tell us about who Jesus is?
- 4. Journal, considering the following:
  - a) Why do you think Mary told Jesus to do something about the problem? What does he say? What is interesting about this interaction?
  - b) Share some of your favorite wedding memories, or if you are too young to have been to many weddings, ask the grown-ups in your life to share some of their wedding memories.
  - c) What would you have thought if you were a servant or guest at the wedding?

Second Reading John 2:1-11 Dr. Matthew S. Brown On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. When the wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, what concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." Now standing there were six stone water jars for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to them, "Fill the jars with water." And they filled them up to the brim. He said to them, "Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward." So they took it. When the steward tasted the water that had become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves the good wine first, and then the inferior wine after the guests have become drunk. But you have kept the good wine until now." Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.

Biblical visions and images of the rule of Christ, such as a heavenly city, the household of God, a new heaven and earth, a marriage feast, and an unending day culminate in the image of the kingdom. 
