- 1. Peace Tag: When Jesus appeared to the disciples after his resurrection, his first words were, "Peace be with you." Even though they were scared and unsure, Jesus came with love and calm. Try playing a game of "Peace Tag" with your family or class. One person is "it" and gently tags someone while saying, "Peace be with you!" That person then becomes "it" and keeps the peace moving. It's a fun and simple way to practice sharing Jesus' peace with others.
- 2. Storytime: In The Moonbow of Mr. B. Bones by J. Patrick Lewis, a boy named Tommy doubts what he cannot see—until a moonbow changes everything. Like Thomas in our gospel story, Tommy needs to see to believe. When he finally does, it transforms him. Thomas also doubts until he sees Jesus with his own eyes, and then joyfully proclaims, "My Lord and my God!" Listen to the story here on YouTube, and read more about the book's connection to scripture at Storypath.
- 3. **Art Activity:** Use paper, crayons, markers, stickers, or whatever you have at home to create a "Peace Be With You" collage that shows what peace looks like to you. Include the words "Peace be with you" somewhere in your art. Hang it in your home to remind you that Jesus offers peace—even when things feel uncertain or scary.
- 4. Wondering Together:
 - a. Why do you think Jesus greeted the disciples with peace?
 - b. What would you have done if you were Thomas?
 - c. When is it hard to believe in something you can't see?
 - d. How can you share peace with someone this week?
