Many: And where is it that we go with Christ?


One: Christ leads us among enemies and strangers, causing us to regard all persons as beloved friends.

We Hear and Respond to the Word

Church Family Moment

1. Read and Reflect: Listen to <u>The Kissing Hand</u> by <u>Audrey Penn</u>, a sweet story about a raccoon who learns he's never alone—even when he can't see his mom. She gives him a kiss in his hand to remind him he's always loved. As Briana Stewart writes, "The security Jesus



offers—'no one will snatch them out of my hand'—is echoed in the mother's gesture." Both the story and the Gospel remind us that God's love is always with us, guiding us on our journey. (Source: Storypath, Fourth Sunday of Easter, Year C)

- **2. Create a Cotton Ball Sheep:** Draw a simple outline of a sheep or print one out. Then glue cotton balls onto the body to make a fluffy sheep. As you create, talk about what it means to be part of Jesus' flock—and how He knows each one of us by name.
- **3. Play "Follow the Shepherd":** Play a listening game and choose one person to be the "shepherd." Everyone else is a "sheep" and closes their eyes or turns around. The shepherd gives quiet directions (like "take two steps forward" or "turn right") and the sheep must listen closely and follow. This helps us practice hearing and trusting the shepherd's voice—just like we listen for Jesus.

4. Wonder Together:

- What do you think Jesus' voice sounds like?
- How do we know we belong to Jesus?
- When have you felt really safe or really loved?
- Why do you think Jesus calls us "sheep"?

Second Reading

John 10:1-18

"Very truly, I tell you, anyone who does not enter the sheepfold by the gate but climbs in by another way is a thief and a bandit. The one who enters by the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. The gatekeeper opens the gate for him, and the sheep hear his voice. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. When he has brought out all his own, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow him because they know his voice. They will not follow a stranger, but they will run from him because they do not know the voice of strangers." Jesus used this figure of speech with them, but they did not understand what he was saying to them. So again Jesus said to them, "Very truly, I tell you, I am the gate for the sheep. All who came before me are thieves and bandits; but the sheep did not listen to them. I am the gate. Whoever enters by me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture. The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly. "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. The hired hand, who is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away—and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. The hired hand runs away because a hired hand does not care for the sheep. I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father. And I lay down my life for the sheep. I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one

flock, one shepherd. For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it up again. I have received this command from my Father."

This is the word of the Lord. Thanks be to God!

MEANING OF CONFIRMATION Rev. Lindsey Odom

Confirmation is a significant step on one's journey of faith. It is when a young person explores and engages questions of theology, including who God is and who we are in relation to God. Confirmation builds on baptism when we are named and claimed by God. In confirmation, youth are confirming the promises made on their behalf by their parents and the congregation at their baptism and are professing faith in Jesus Christ for themselves. Confirmation is more than a personal decision to join the church, it is also a commitment to live one's life for God, and each one of these confirmands and their Statements of Faith have reflected this.

Through confirmation, these youth have learned what it means to be a Christian and are now being ushered into lives of faithful discipleship.
