## **Church Family Moment**

 Story Time: Listen to a <u>readaloud</u> of *Bear Came Along* by Richard T. Morris. In this story, Bear meets new friends as he floats down the river. They discover life is better together. Paul also met someone new— Lydia—and shared Jesus' love with her. Like Bear and his friends, Paul and Lydia learned that God brings people together to build joyful, loving communities.



- 2. Play "Pass the Message": Whisper a short message like "Jesus loves you!" down the line. See how it changes—or stays the same! Talk about how the good news of Jesus spreads from person to person, just like it did from Paul to Lydia.
- **3. Share the Love:** Write or draw a message to someone you care about. It could be a card, a note, or a simple picture. Just like Lydia shared the message of Jesus with others, we can too—through words and kindness.

## 4. Wondering Questions:

- I wonder how Paul felt when he had his dream.
- I wonder why Lydia wanted to follow Jesus.
- I wonder how we can tell others about Jesus.

Second Reading Acts 16:6-15 Dr. Matthew S. Brown They went through the region of Phrygia and Galatia, having been forbidden by the Holy Spirit to speak the word in Asia. When they had come opposite Mysia, they attempted to go into Bithynia, but the Spirit of Jesus did not allow them; so, passing by Mysia, they went down to Troas. During the night Paul had a vision: there stood a man of Macedonia pleading with him and saying, "Come over to Macedonia and help us." When he had seen the vision, we immediately tried to cross over to Macedonia, being convinced that God had called us to proclaim the good news to them. We set sail from Troas and took a straight course to Samothrace, the following day to Neapolis, and from there to Philippi, which is a leading city of the district of Macedonia and a Roman colony. We remained in this city for some days. On the sabbath day we went outside the gate by the river, where we supposed there was a place of prayer; and we sat down and spoke to the women who had gathered there. A certain woman named Lydia, a worshiper of God, was listening to us; she was from the city of Thyatira and a dealer in purple cloth. The Lord opened her heart to listen eagerly to what was said by Paul. When she and her household were baptized, she urged us, saying, "If you have judged me to be faithful to the Lord, come and stay at my home." And she prevailed upon us.


