

Church Family Moment

1. Story Connection: Listen to a <u>readaloud</u> of *Yertle the* Turtle by Dr. Seuss. In this story, Yertle tries to stack all the turtles beneath him so he can feel more important. But he learns that putting others down isn't the way to be great. This connects to Jesus' parable of the banquet, where we learn that we should not try to

make ourselves look better than others.



- 2. Hospitality at Home: If you're together on a holiday weekend, talk as a family about who else might need to feel included like a neighbor, a classmate, or someone from church. Choose one way to help them feel welcome, such as inviting them over, sending a kind message, making a special card, or baking some cookies.
- 3. Game: Play a backward version of musical chairs. Instead of taking a chair away each round, add an extra chair and invite someone else to join the game. Celebrate making more room instead of less! Connect this to how Jesus tells us to make space at the table for others, especially those who might be left out.
- 4. Journal, considering the following:
 - I wonder how it feels to sit in the lowest seat at a table.
 - I wonder why Jesus wanted people to invite those who usually get left out.
 - I wonder if you have ever felt especially welcome. Who made you feel that way?
 - I wonder how we can make space for others the way Jesus did.

Second Reading Luke 14:1, 7-14 Rev. Lindsey Odom On one occasion when Jesus was going to the house of a leader of the Pharisees to eat a meal on the sabbath, they were watching him closely. When he noticed how the guests chose the places of honor, he told them a parable. "When you are invited by someone to a wedding banquet, do not sit down at the place of honor, in case someone more distinguished than you has been invited by your host; and the host who invited both of you may come and say to you, "Give this person your place,' and then in disgrace you would start to take the lowest place. But when you are invited, go and sit down at the lowest place, so that when your host comes, he may say to you, "Friend, move up higher'; then you will be honored in the presence of all who sit at the table with you. For all who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted." He said also to the one who had invited him, "When you give a luncheon or a dinner, do not invite your friends or your brothers or your relatives or rich neighbors, in case they may invite you in return, and you would be repaid. But when you give a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind. And you will be blessed, because they cannot repay you, for you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous."
