

 Advent Begins — Hope! Today is the first Sunday of Advent! During Advent, we get ready for Jesus, the Light of the World. Watch this <u>short video</u> about Advent. You can also light a virtual Advent wreath <u>here</u>. This week we light the candle of Hope, because God's promises bring light to the world.



- Advent Craft Stars of Hope: Stars help us look for signs of Jesus.
 Make a star to hang in your house as a reminder to watch for God's light around you! You can try a paper star, or make one from pipe cleaners, beads, popsicle sticks, or just draw and decorate one however you like.
- 3. Story Connection Waiting with Eyes Open: Listen to <u>Waiting</u> by Kevin Henkes. The characters are waiting and watching, just like us in Advent! Paul tells us in Romans 13 to "wake up" and pay attention to how Jesus is already working in the world. While we wait for Christmas, we can also look around and notice love, kindness, and hope happening right now.

- a. I wonder what it feels like to wait for something exciting.
- b. I wonder what it means to "wake up" to God's love.
- c. I wonder how your star can remind you to look for Jesus every day.

First Reading Isaiah 2:1-5 Rev. White

The word that Isaiah son of Amoz saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem. In days to come the mountain of the Lord's house shall be established as the highest of the mountains, and shall be raised above the hills; all the nations shall stream to it. Many peoples shall come and say, "Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, to the house of the God of Jacob; that he may teach us his ways and that we may walk in his paths." For out of Zion shall go forth instruction, and the word of the Lord from Jerusalem.4 He shall judge between the nations, and shall arbitrate for many peoples; they shall beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more. Second Reading Romans 13:8-14 Rev. Odom Owe no one anything, except to love one another; for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law. The commandments, "You shall not commit adultery; You shall not murder; You shall not steal; You shall not covet"; and any other commandment, are summed up in this word, "Love your neighbor as yourself." Love does no wrong to a neighbor; therefore, love is the fulfilling of the law. Besides this, you know what time it is, how it is now the moment for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we became believers; the night is far gone, the day is near. Let us then lay aside the works of darkness and put on the armor of light; let us live honorably as in the day, not in reveling and drunkenness, not in debauchery and licentiousness, not in quarreling and jealousy. Instead, put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires.

This is the word of the Lord. Thanks be to God!
