Church Family Moment

1. **Story Connection:** Matthew gives us the clearest picture we have of Joseph—a faithful man who listens to God and chooses love, even when it is hard.

Father and Son: A Nativity Story imagines what Joseph may have felt as he accepted a quiet, supporting role in God's plan. His love did not seek attention or power, but showed up through trust, care, and obedience. Source: Virginia C. Thomas and Ann Thomas Knox at StoryPath.

- 2. **Music Connection:** : <u>Listen</u> to "Only Joseph" by Garrison Doles. As you listen, notice how Joseph's small, faithful choices play a big part in the Christmas story. Talk about what we can learn from the way Joseph loves quietly and faithfully.
- 3. **Activity:** Joseph is told to name the child *Jesus*, which means "God saves." Talk about the names in your family. Who chose them? What do they mean? Then wonder together what Jesus' name tells us about who he is and why he came

4. Wonder Together:

- a. I wonder what it was like for Joseph to trust God when the future was unclear.
- b. I wonder how love can show up in quiet ways.
- c. I wonder what Joseph teaches us about faithfulness.
- d. I wonder how we can practice this kind of love this week.

Second Reading Mathew 1:18-25 Dr. Sandy Hull Now the birth of Jesus the Messiah took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been engaged to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. Her husband Joseph, being a righteous man and unwilling to expose her to public disgrace, planned to dismiss her quietly. But just when he had resolved to do this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." All this took place to fulfill what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet: "Look, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel," which means, "God is with us." When Joseph awoke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him; he took her as his wife, but had no marital relations with her until she had borne a son; and he named him Jesus.



SPICED HOLIDAY TEA (As sipped on at the Women's Advent Tea!)

7 cups water

1 ½ cups sugar

5 tea bags

1 (6 oz) can frozen orange juice concentrate, thawed, plus 1 can water

4 T. bottled lemon juice

4 cups water

5 cinnamon sticks

1 T. whole cloves



1.Bring the 7 cups water to boil in a large pot. Add the sugar and stir and cook until the sugar dissolves. Add the tea bags.Remove from heat and steep for 10 minutes; remove tea bags.

2.Add the orange juice concentrate and 1 can of water; add lemon juice and stir to combine.

3.In a separate pot, combine the 4 cups of water, the cinnamon sticks and the cloves. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer, covered, for 30 minutes; strain, and add to the tea mixture.

4.Serve hot.

Yield: 3 ¼ quarts



SMPC'S "FAMOUS" PUNCH

3 cups sugar

6 cups water

1 (12 oz) frozen orange juice concentrate, thawed

6 oz bottled lemon juice

1 (46 oz) can pineapple juice

4 bananas

2 (2 liter) bottles ginger ale

2 (10 cup) plastic containers with lids

Heat water to boiling and then add sugar, stir to dissolve. Add orange juice and lemon juice to sugar mixture. Break 2 bananas into chunks, add to a blender with ½ of pineapple juice, process until smooth and pureed. Add to sugar/juice mixture, repeat with remaining bananas and pineapple juice. Stir to combine. Divide equally between the 2 plastic containers, cover with lids and freeze until firm, preferably at least two days before serving. When ready to serve, take containers of base out of freezer about 2 hours before planning to serve. One base per punch bowl. As the base thaws enough to place in punch bowl break into large chunks. Just before serving, pour 1 (2 liter) bottle of ginger ale into each punch bowl with base. Each base makes about 25 servings. This recipe makes 50 servings.
