1. **Story Connection:** [Watch](#) *Draw the Line* by Kathryn Otoshi. This is a **wordless book** that tells its story entirely through pictures. It invites us to think about conflict, listening, boundaries, and working things out with one another—just as Jesus teaches in today's scripture. A helpful activity guide can be found [here](#).
2. **Work Together:** Try a cooperative activity such as completing a puzzle together or creating a shared drawing. Notice how listening, patience, and teamwork help the task go more smoothly. Talk about how these same skills can help repair relationships when there is conflict.
3. **Craft** Create a simple calm-down jar using a clear container, water, glitter, and a little glue. Shake it up and watch the glitter slowly settle. This can be a reminder that taking time to calm down often helps us speak kindly and work through problems more peacefully.
4. **Wonder Together:**
 - a. I wonder why Jesus said to go directly to the person you are upset with.
 - b. I wonder how it feels when someone talks with you instead of about you.
 - c. I wonder what helps you calm down when you are angry or hurt.
 - d. I wonder how we can practice being kind and honest this week.

Second Reading Matthew 18:15-17 (NLT) Dr. Hull
“If another believer sins against you, go privately and point out the offense. If the other person listens and confesses it, you have won that person back. But if you are unsuccessful, take one or two others with you and go back again, so that everything you say may be confirmed by two or three witnesses. If the person still refuses to listen, take your case to the church. Then if he or she won’t accept the church’s decision, treat that person as a pagan or a corrupt tax collector.
